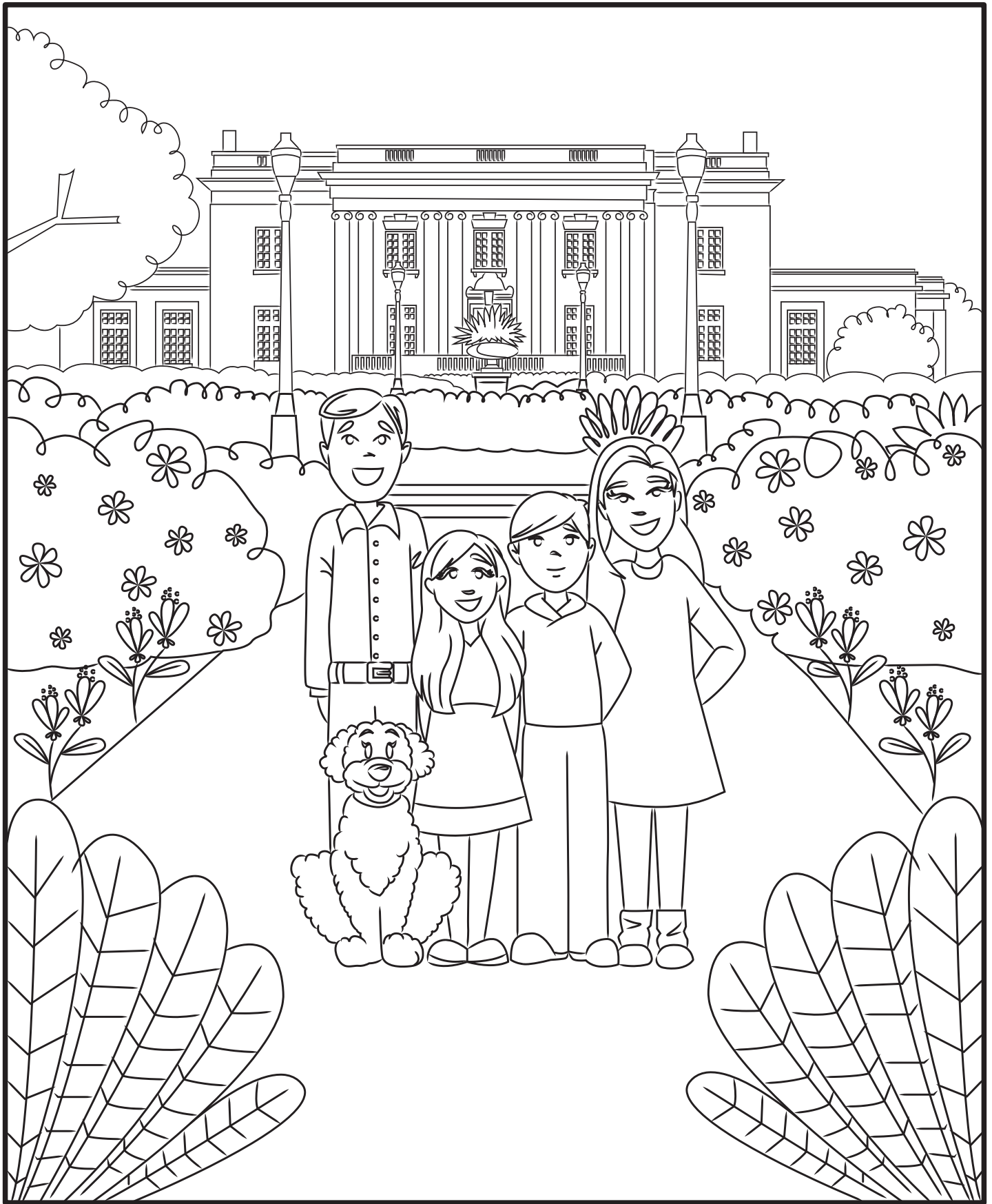

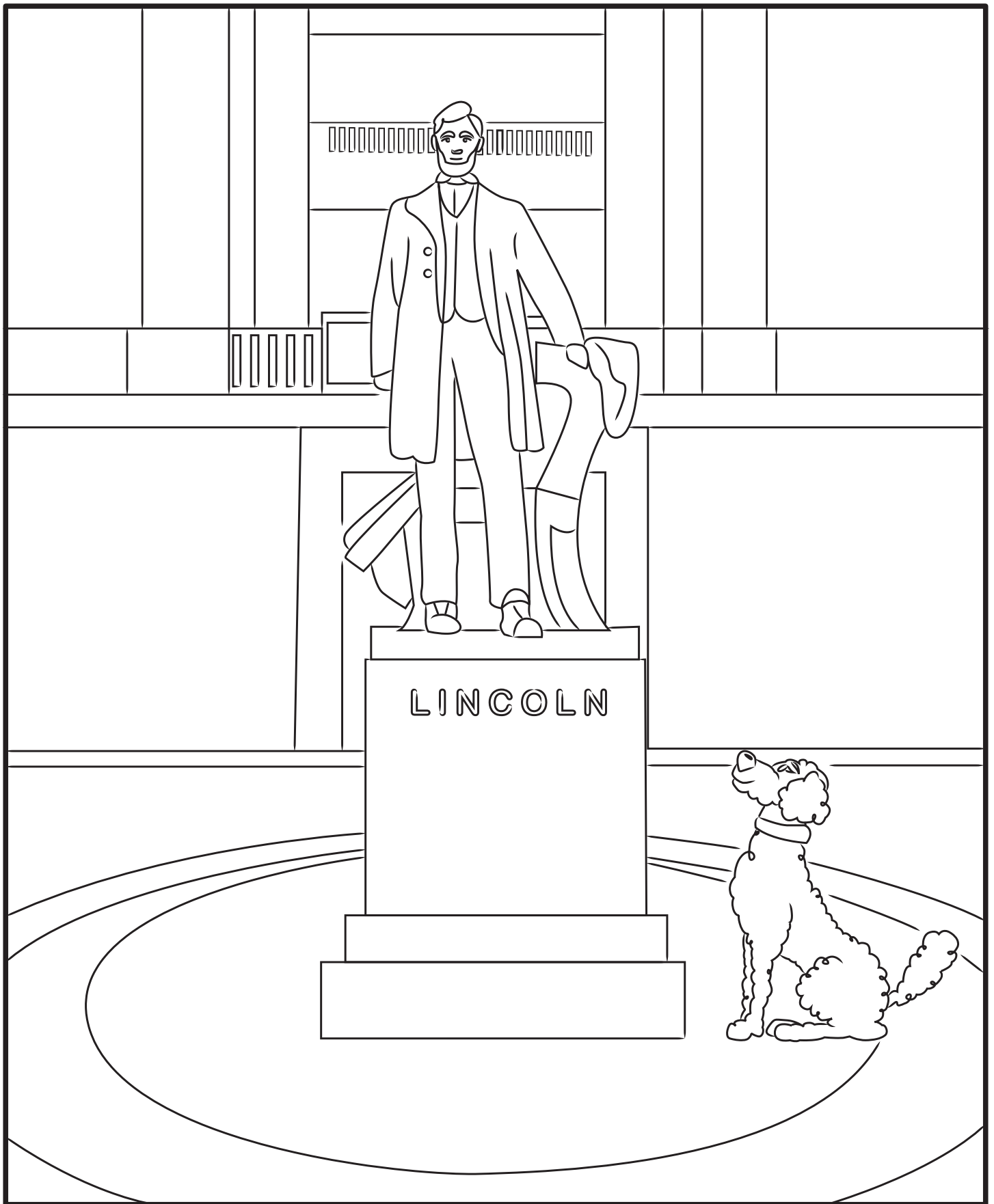

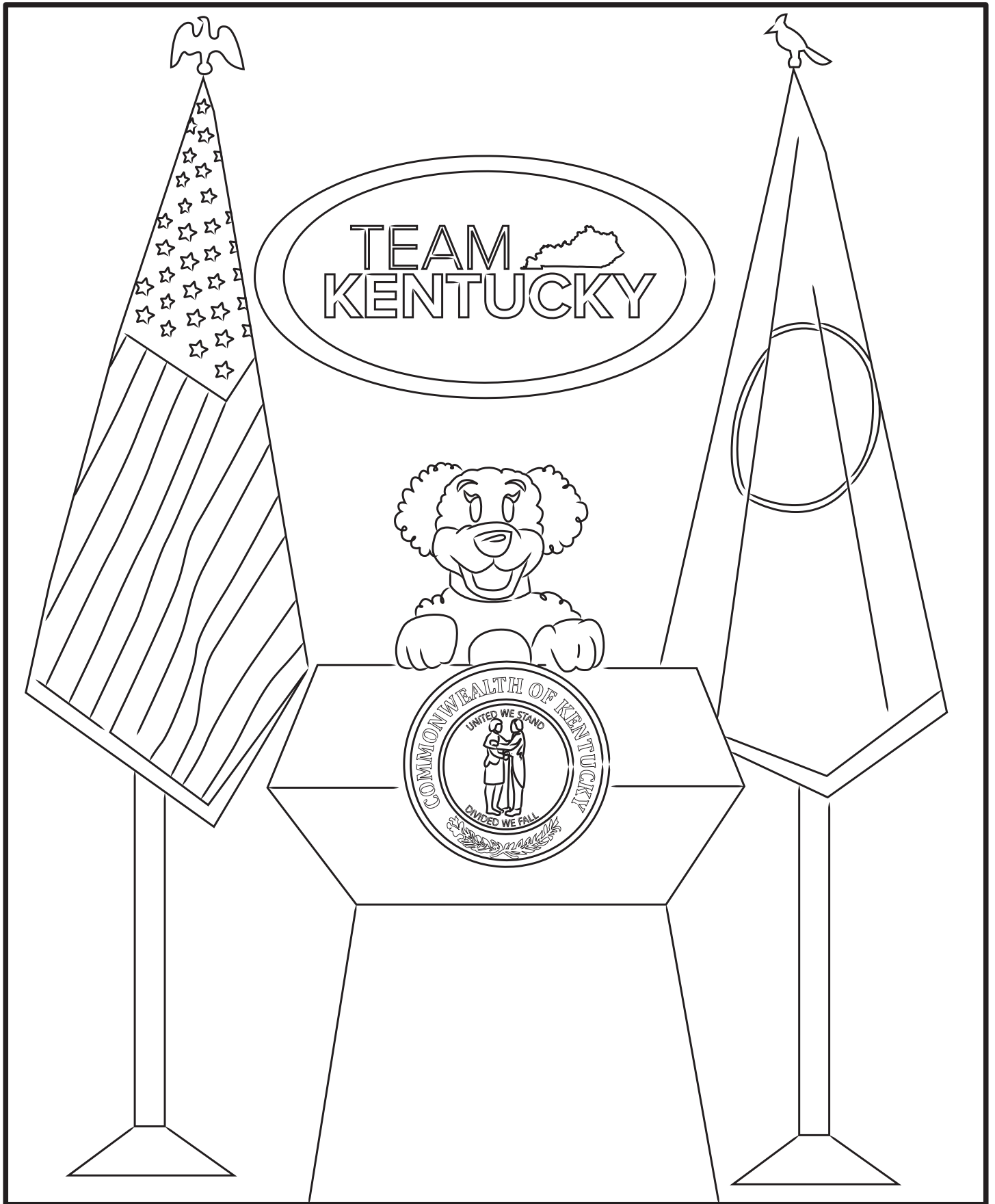
Hi, I'm Winnie Beshear!

I like to visit the Kentucky State Capitol.



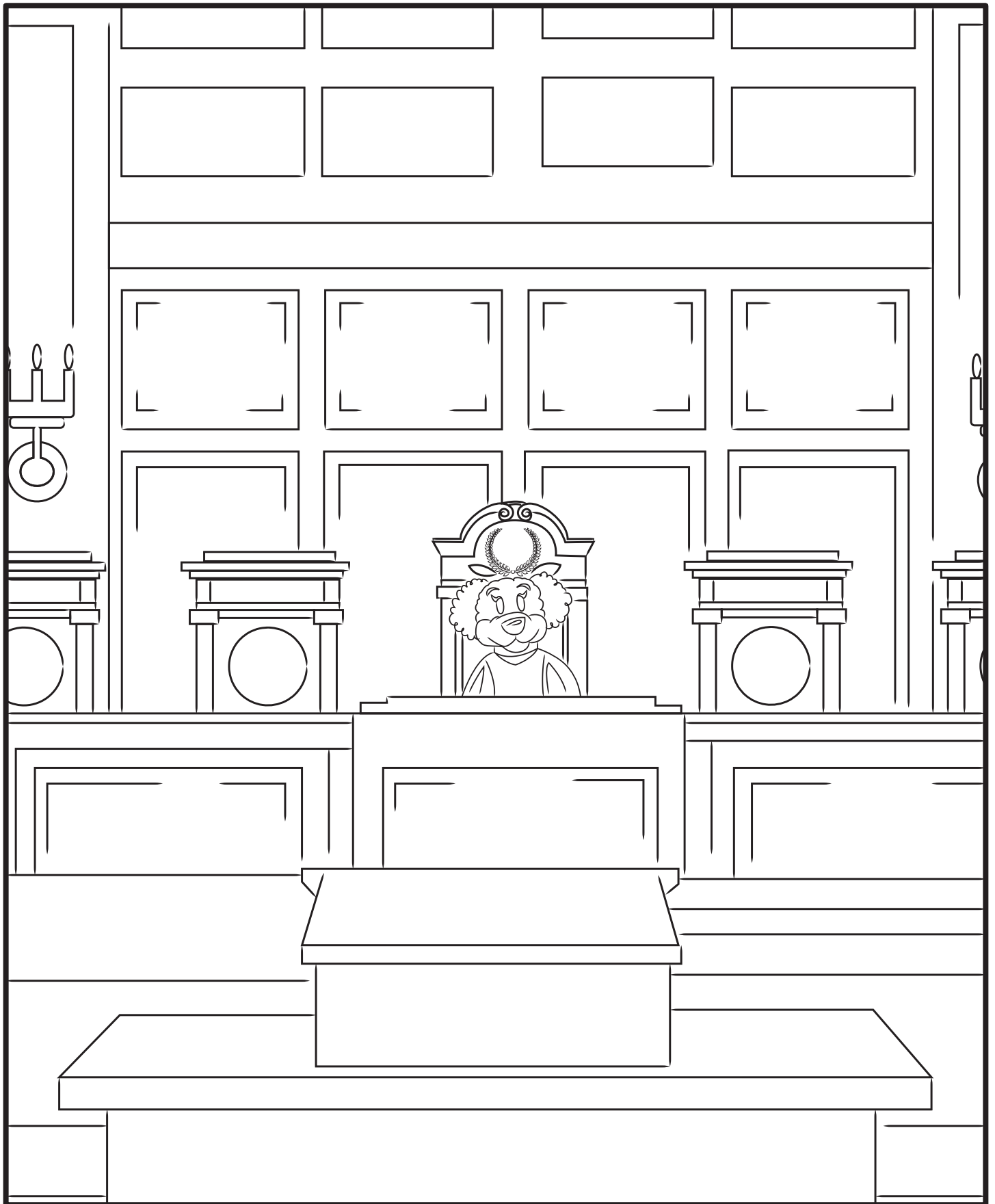
One of the first things you see when you enter the capitol building is the Capitol Rotunda. President Abraham Lincoln stands in the center of the rotunda.



The rotunda is where Kentuckians come to let their voices be heard, and sometimes my dad holds press conferences and events there.



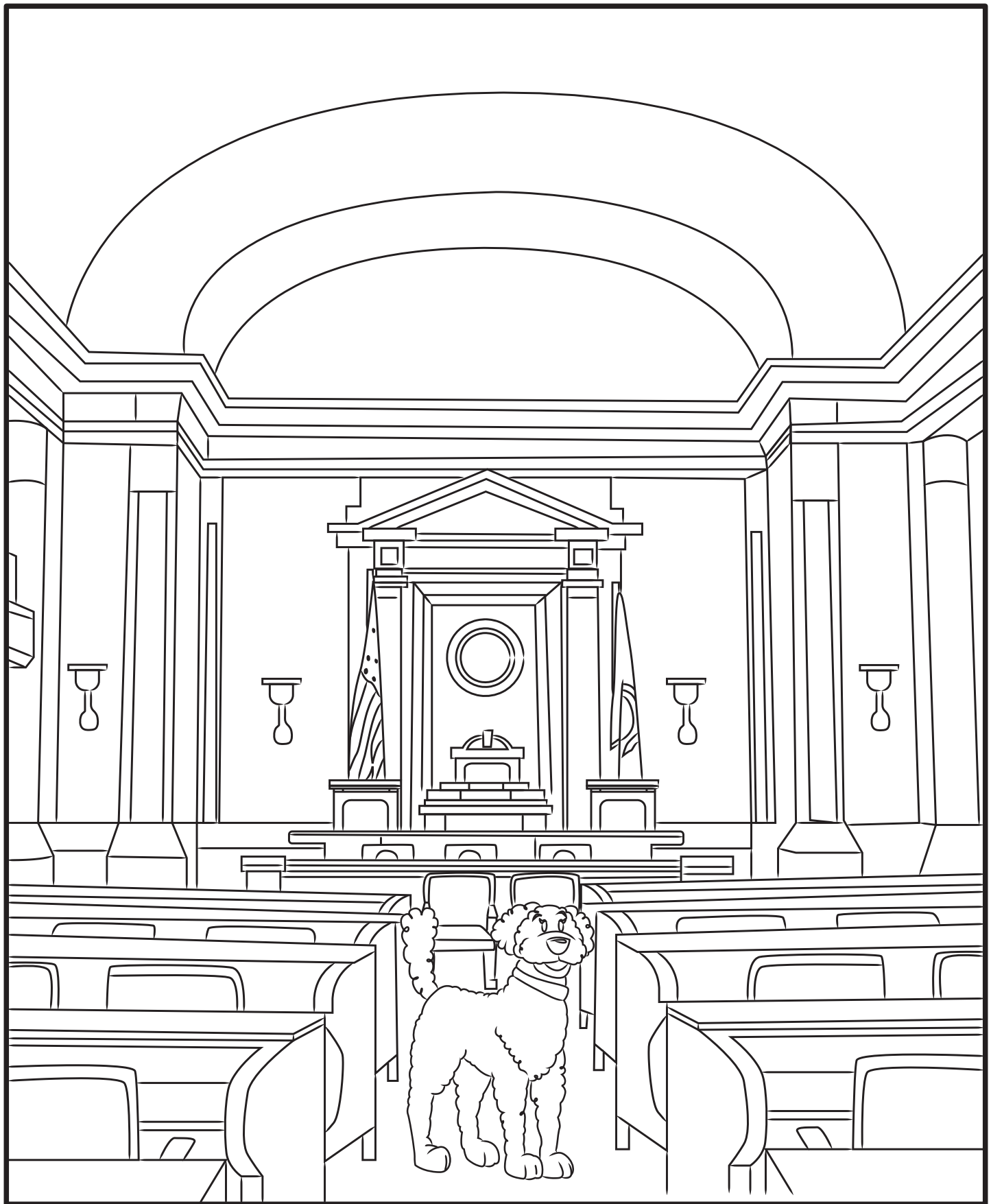
Another popular attraction is the First Ladies of Kentucky Miniatures Collection. There is a doll representing every Kentucky first lady. Looook, here's my mom and me!



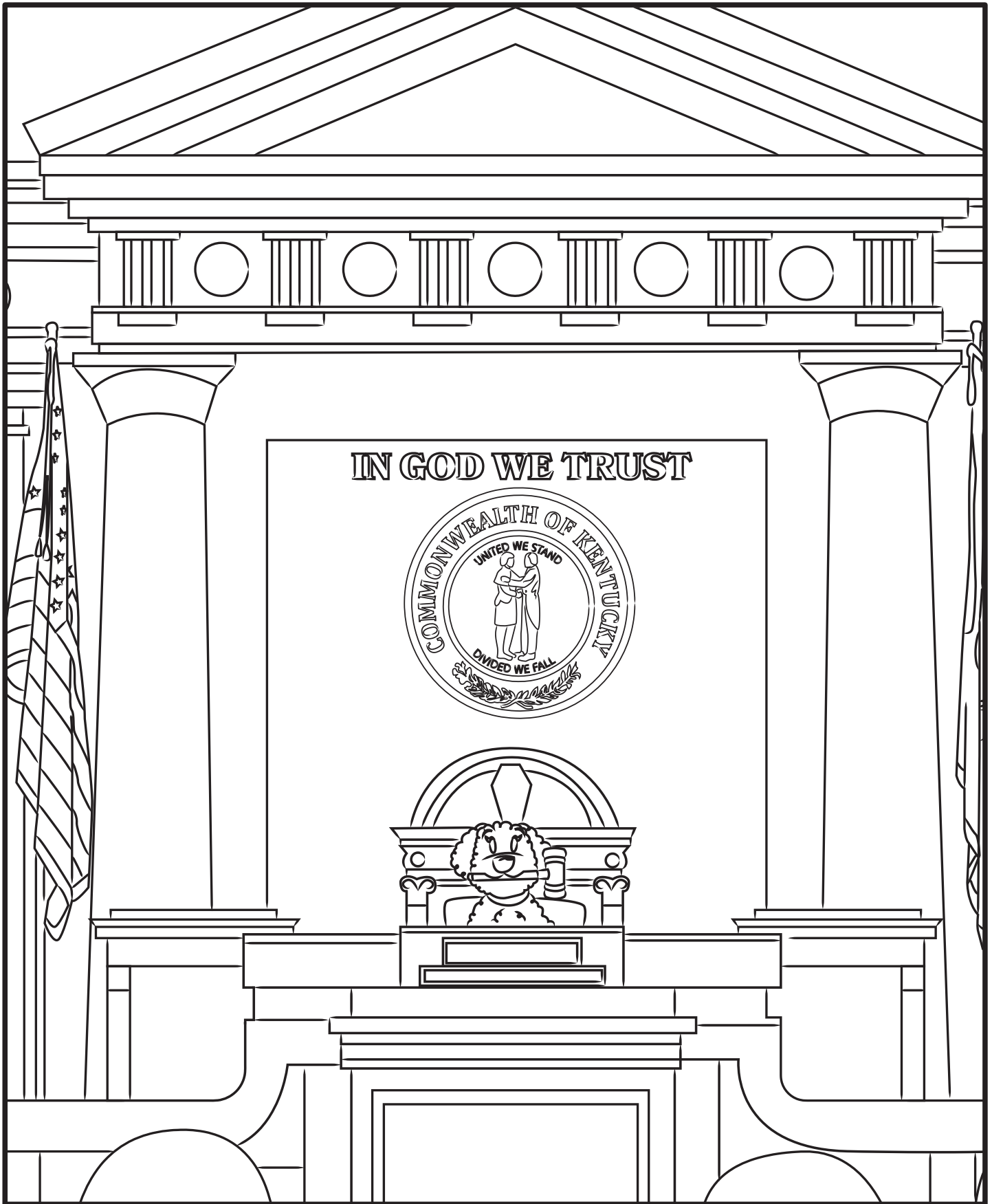
On the second floor is the Supreme Court.
The Supreme Court is the highest court in Kentucky!



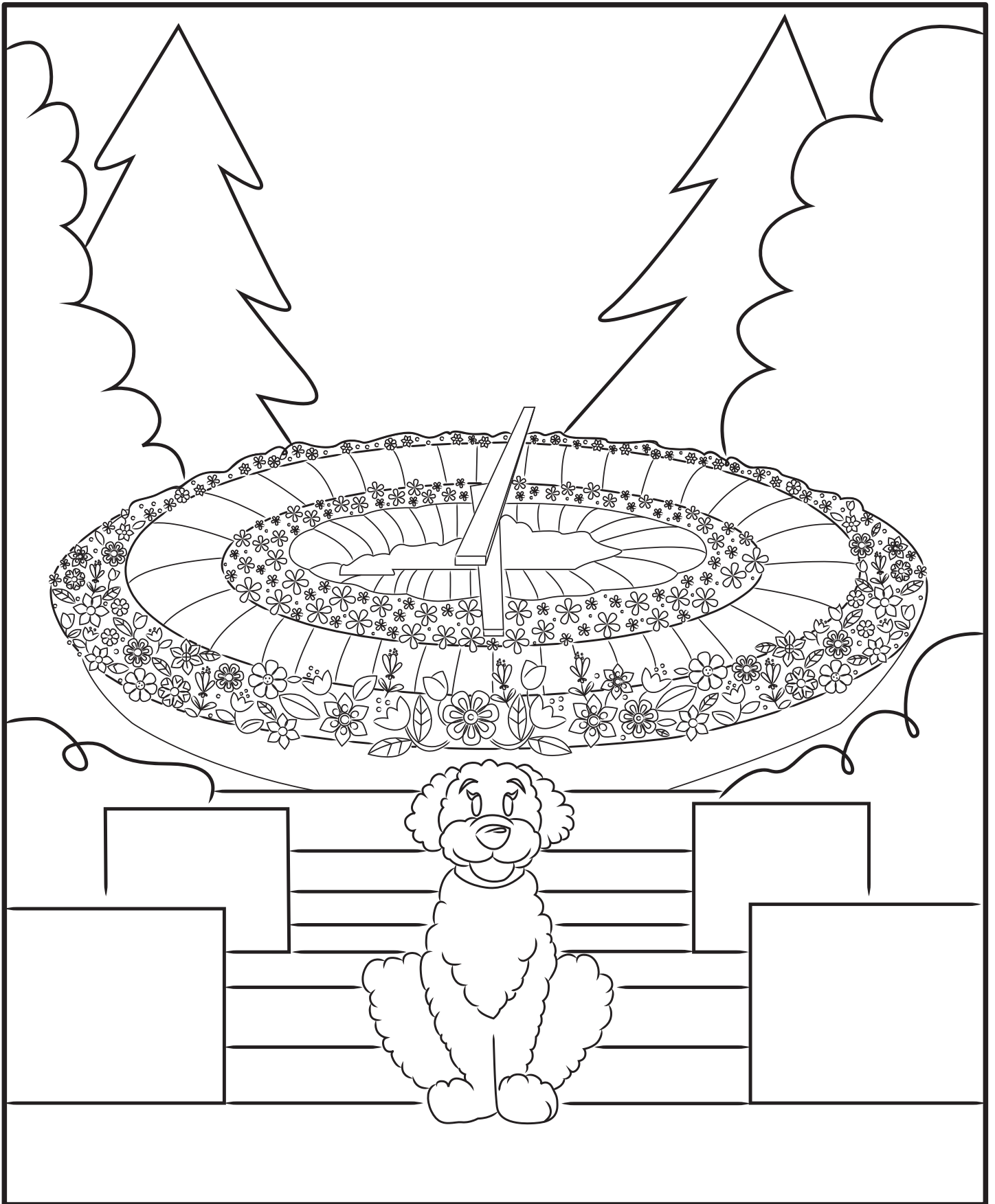
The State Reception Room is also on the second floor. It's one of the most beautiful rooms in the capitol, and was inspired by grand salons in European palaces.
