STATE OFFENSE DATA

The total number of Group A crimes reported by law enforcement agencies in Kentucky during the previous year is shown in the chart above. These overall statistics reflect only offenses reported to or known by the police.

When making comparisons between years, the following should be taken into account: (1) Data is not inclusive of all offenses reported to the police; (2) Increases or decreases in the number of crimes reported can be attributed to a variety of factors, including methods of reporting and tabulating on the part of law enforcement agencies; (3) Differing levels of citizen awareness and their responsibility to report crimes have a direct impact on the number of reports received by police.
