Re: Electrical Inspection Grace Period

Dear Commissioner Rand:

The severe weather that took place beginning July 26, 2022 in eastern Kentucky has left thousands without power. In an effort to restore power and protect life and property as expediently as possible, I am taking the following action:

Pursuant to KRS 39A.070(3) and Executive Order 2022-457, paragraph 6, the Division of Emergency Management directs the Department of Housing, Buildings and Construction to allow electric utility companies to restore power to customers affected by the abovementioned severe weather for up to fourteen (14) days without a service inspection. At or before the conclusion of this fourteen (14) day period, service inspections must be completed by a Kentucky certified electrical inspector.

This directive is limited to electric utility companies and customers in the following counties: Breathitt, Clay, Floyd, Johnson, Knott, Leslie, Letcher, Magoffin, Martin, Owsley, Perry, Pike, and Wolfe.

Re: Licensed Electrician Shortage

Dear Commissioner Rand:


One challenge to the recovery and rebuilding efforts for those impacted by the floods and severe weather events in beginning July 26, 2022 in eastern Kentucky continues to be the insufficient number of available Kentucky licensed electricians. As a result, I am taking the following action:

Pursuant to KRS 39A.070(3) and Executive Order 2022-457 paragraph 6, the Division of Emergency Management directs the Department of Housing, Building and Construction to allow out-of-state electricians who are not licensed in Kentucky to perform volunteer work in Kentucky to assist with the rebuilding efforts related to the severe weather events beginning July 26, 2022, in the following eastern Kentucky counties: Breathitt, Clay, Floyd, Johnson, Knott, Leslie, Letcher, Magoffin, Martin, Owsley, Perry, Pike, and Wolfe.

This directive is limited to electricians who are licensed in their home state, in good standing with his or her licensing jurisdiction, and are offering services on a volunteer basis. Any electrical work performed by an out-of-state electrician under this directive shall be permitted and inspected by a Kentucky electrical inspector. Electricians who hold a license in their home state would not be eligible to perform for-profit electrical work without the applicable Kentucky license.
