Additional Projects Receiving Funds From the 2023 CDBG Program

- The Menifee County Fiscal Court has been awarded \$100,000 to install a new generator and help expand the parking lot at the Menifee County Senior Citizens Center and Regional Kitchen. The center currently serves over 7,300 meals per month.
 - Last year, Gov. Beshear <u>announced</u> \$946,000 from Kentucky's CDBG program to expand the Menifee County Senior Center Kitchen.
- The city of Taylorsville has been awarded \$750,000 to establish an urgent care clinic and healthcare center at 847 Taylorsville Road to be operated by University of Louisville Health. The space will include twelve exam rooms, three provider offices, a waiting room and an x-ray room.
- The Taylor County Fiscal Court has been awarded \$400,000 to purchase equipment for Green River Meats, LLC. This project entails the purchase of equipment to assist Green River Meats, LLC, in operating a meat processing facility with retail space. The company expects to hire 20 new employees at the facility.
- The Daviess County Fiscal Court has been awarded \$1,000,000 to work with Habitat for Humanity of Owensboro-Daviess County to develop a 12-lot neighborhood. CDBG funds will be used for the engineering and construction of the necessary infrastructure to support the new neighborhood. Approximately half of the CDBG funds will be used to purchase the materials needed to build the first four homes.
- The city of Augusta has been awarded \$132,000 to upgrade water meters for 360 homes. By replacing these meters, the city will get a more accurate reading of residential water usage.
- The Campbell County Fiscal Court has been awarded \$996,526 to work alongside the Newport Millennium Housing Corporation to rehabilitate two homes and build five homes on vacant lots. Once each home is completed, it will be sold to an eligible low-to-moderate-income homeowner.
- The Hardin County Fiscal Court has been awarded \$1,000,000 to construct a 48-unit housing complex on the Elizabethtown Community and Technical College (ECTC) campus. 36 will be 2-bedroom and 12 will be 3-bedroom units. All units will house students at the ECTC Nursing Program.
- The city of Winchester has been awarded \$1,000,000 to acquire 13 parcels of land containing nine structures along Lincoln Street and Seaboard Street. This funding will go toward the demolition of those nine structures, the clearance of four vacant lots, the relocation of six renters and one homeowner and the construction of five new homes to serve low-to-moderate-income households.
