I write to express my serious concerns over harmful retaliatory actions on Kentucky bourbon and request your assistance on avoiding a preventable catastrophe for our Kentucky families.

As you know, bourbon is a key economic driver in the commonwealth. The industry accounts for more than \$9 billion in economic output each year and supports more than 23,100 jobs statewide. Annual payroll tops \$1.63 billion. Ongoing capital investment creates more than 5,600 new jobs each year. Finally, the Kentucky Bourbon Trail – the biggest driver of Kentucky's recordbreaking \$13.8 billion-a-year tourism industry – attracts more than 2.55 million visitors to the commonwealth every year.

Federal tariffs imposed yesterday have already led to retaliatory actions on Kentucky bourbon that will be costly, disruptive, and harmful to the many thousands of Kentucky men and women who support their families working in the industry. We, as Kentuckians, are left paying a larger economic price than the rest of the country, at a time when prices are already too high.
