



Selected Projects for the Land & Water Conservation Fund (LWCF)

Below is a full list of projects selected by Gov. Andy Beshear to receive funding from the federal LWCF Program. This is the first step in a process to send each project individually to the National Park Service for review. Once a project receives federal approval, funding will be released.

In total, \$7.2 million are planned to go to 50 projects in Kentucky.

1. City of Columbia (Adair County)

- The city of Columbia would use \$50,000 in funding from the LWCF to help make improvements to the Columbia City Park, including pickleball courts and a sensory playground for children in the community.

2. Barren County Fiscal Court

- The Barren County Fiscal Court would use \$250,000 in funding from the LWCF to help make lighting and parking improvements at the Glasgow-Barren County Soccer Complex.

3. City of Middlesboro (Bell County)

- The city of Middlesboro would use \$147,500 in funding from the LWCF to help with upgrades at the Lincoln School Park. Upgrades would include new play structures.

4. City of Pineville (Bell County)

- The city of Pineville would use \$138,925 in funding from the LWCF to help with upgrades at Walnut Street Mini Park. Upgrades would include a splash pad and a pickleball court.

5. City of Danville (Boyle County)

- The city of Danville would use \$250,000 in funding from the LWCF to help with upgrades to Millenium Park.

6. Breathitt County Fiscal Court

- The Breathitt County Fiscal Court would use \$125,000 in funding from the LWCF to help build a picnic shelter, fish weigh station, and restroom facilities.

7. City of Shepherdsville (Bullitt County)

- The city of Shepherdsville would use \$250,000 in funding from the LWCF to help advance the Shepherdsville City Park Town Center Enhancement Project.

8. City of Hillview (Bullitt County)

- The city of Hillview would use \$37,153 in funding from the LWCF to help install six pieces of stationary exercise equipment along an existing walking trail at Hillview City Park.

9. City of Fredonia (Caldwell County)

- The city of Fredonia would use \$92,670 in funding from the LWCF to help revitalize Buddy Rogers Park, installing a new tee ball field and repairing the park's concession and barbecue pit areas.

10. City of Murray (Calloway County)

- The city of Murray would use \$250,000 in funding from the LWCF to help construct a welcome center at Central Park.

11. City of Silver Grove (Campbell County)

- The city of Silver Grove would use \$99,812 in funding from the LWCF to help develop a walking trail around the Green Valley Pond.

12. Campbell County Fiscal Court

- The Campbell County Fiscal Court would use \$77,890 in funding from the LWCF to help build a new playground at A.J. Jolly Park.

13. City of Grayson (Carter County)

- The city of Grayson would use \$87,500 in funding from the LWCF to help build an inclusive swing area in the existing Grayson Sports Park.

14. Elliott County Fiscal Court

- The Elliott County Fiscal Court would use \$250,000 in funding from the LWCF to help build a concessions and restroom facility at Addison Field.

15. City of Fulton (Fulton County)

- The city of Fulton would use \$125,000 in funding from the LWCF to help make improvements at Pontotoc Park. Improvements would include a new accessible restroom facility and decorative plazas in three corners of the park.

16. Hancock County Fiscal Court

- The Hancock County Fiscal Court would use \$245,445 in funding from the LWCF to help remove aging playground equipment at Vastwood Park and replace it with new

equipment.

17. Hopkins County Fiscal Court

- The Hopkins County Fiscal Court would use \$26,013 in funding from the LWCF to help purchase equipment for two new soccer fields in Madisonville.

18. City of Earlington (Hopkins County)

- The city of Earlington would use \$77,500 in funding from the LWCF to help improve parking and signage at the Earlington City Park.

19. City of Dawson Springs (Hopkins County)

- The city of Dawson Springs would use \$75,000 in funding from the LWCF to help purchase new lighting fixtures for Riverside Park.

20. City of Mortons Gap (Hopkins County)

- The city of Mortons Gap would use \$79,650 in funding from the LWCF to help install a new public restroom facility at Frank Stafford Park.

21. City of McKee (Jackson County)

- The city of McKee would use \$60,090 in funding from the LWCF to help renovate Jack Gabbard Park. Renovations would include restrooms, parking, walking trails, and resurfacing the playground area with rubber surfacing.

22. City of Nicholasville (Jessamine County)

- The city of Nicholasville would use \$113,789 in funding from the LWCF to help build six pickleball courts at City County Park.

23. City of London (Laurel County)

- The city of London would use \$149,029 in funding from the LWCF to help support the construction of a Splash Pad at Levi Jackson Wilderness Road Park beside the existing swimming pool.

24. City of Beattyville (Lee County)

- The city of Beattyville would use \$125,000 in funding from the LWCF to help construction a river overlook looking over the North Fork Kentucky River.

25. Leslie County Fiscal Court

- The Leslie County Fiscal Court would use \$250,000 in funding from the LWCF to help construct a bathhouse and restrooms at the Leeco Campground and RV Park.

26. Leslie County Fiscal Court

- The Leslie County Fiscal Court would use \$240,000 in funding from the LWCF to help install two weather-resistant concrete kayak launches and parking lots.

27. City of Hyden (Leslie County)

- The city of Hyden would use \$125,000 in funding from the LWCF to help construct a pavilion at a park in the community.

28. Lewis County Fiscal Court

- The Lewis County Fiscal Court would use \$250,000 in funding from the LWCF to help construct new baseball and softball fields.

29. City of Richmond (Madison County)

- The city of Richmond would use \$222,000 in funding from the LWCF to help with the construction of mountain bike trails and trail amenities at the Richmond Regional Sports Park.

30. Marshall County Fiscal Court

- The Marshall County Fiscal Court would use \$250,000 in funding from the LWCF to help build restrooms and a concession stand at Mike Miller Park.

31. Calvert City (Marshall County)

- Calvert City would use \$127,110 in funding from the LWCF to help expand the current multi-use trails around Doctors Park.

32. Mason County Fiscal Court

- The Mason County Fiscal Court would use \$80,216 in funding from the LWCF to help make improvements to the Cummins Nature Preserve.

33. City of Maysville (Mason County)

- The city of Maysville would use \$122,500 in funding from the LWCF to help install four splash pads in the downtown area.

34. Menifee County Fiscal Court

- The Menifee County Fiscal Court would use \$100,000 in funding from the LWCF to help construct a new accessible playground.

35. City of Edmonton (Metcalf County)

- The city of Edmonton would use \$197,769 in funding from the LWCF to help provide shade structures and upgrades to the walking trail and parking lots at Edmonton Memorial Park.

36. City of Bloomfield (Nelson County)

- The city of Bloomfield would use \$150,000 in funding from the LWCF to relocate the playground at the city park to a flatter area, making it more accessible.

37. Ohio County Fiscal Court

- The Ohio County Fiscal Court would use \$37,170 in funding from the LWCF to purchase equipment to help build a football field at the county park.

38. Owsley County Fiscal Court

- The Owsley County Fiscal Court would use \$240,000 in funding from the LWCF to help construct a kayak and canoe launch site, walking trails, and picnic areas in Booneville.

39. City of Booneville (Owsley County)

- The city of Booneville would use \$75,100 in funding from the LWCF to help provide a safe and convenient access point for kayakers to launch their kayaks into the water of the South Fork Kentucky River.

40. City of Stanton (Powell County)

- The city of Stanton would use \$250,000 in funding from the LWCF to help rehabilitate and improve the soccer fields currently located in the Stanton City Community Park.

41. City of Mt. Vernon (Rockcastle County)

- The city of Mt. Vernon would use \$67,500 in funding from the LWCF to remodel the existing bath house, add a new shelter, a new walkway, new landscaping, new benches, new trash receptacles, and new picnic tables to the Lake Linville Park and Campground.

42. Rockcastle County Fiscal Court

- The Rockcastle County Fiscal Court would use \$60,000 in funding from the LWCF to make modifications to Brodhead ball field. Modifications include adding a new baseball/softball field, two bleachers, two dugouts, lighting arrangements, fencing, fill dirt, topsoil, gravel, and a gate for the parking lot.

43. City of Russell Springs (Russell County)

- The city of Russell Springs would use \$205,995 in funding from the LWCF to help construct a par 3 golf course within the existing Russell Springs City Park.

44. Scott County Fiscal Court

- The Scott County Fiscal Court would use \$250,000 in funding from the LWCF to help make improvements to the Brooking Park tennis courts.

45. City of Elkton (Todd County)

- The city of Elkton would use \$236,100 in funding from the LWCF to help replace light fixtures and poles on one baseball field at the city-county park. Funds would also help

construct new pickleball courts.

46. Trimble County Fiscal Court

- The Trimble County Fiscal Court would use \$237,543 in funding from the LWCF to help install a splash pad at Trimble County Park.

47. Webster County Fiscal Court

- The Webster County Fiscal Court would use \$125,000 in funding from the LWCF to help construct a walking trail through Canaan Ridge Park.

48. City of Clay (Webster County)

- The city of Clay would use \$31,350 in funding from the LWCF to help make lighting upgrades at the city park.

49. City of Dixon (Webster County)

- The city of Dixon would use \$29,142 in funding from the LWCF to help install new lighting along the walking trail at Baker Park, among other improvements.

50. Whitley County Fiscal Court

- The Whitley County Fiscal Court would use \$130,000 in funding from the LWCF to help build a second restroom facility at the fairgrounds.
