


Significant snow and ice accumulations will result in hazardous travel and may cause numerous power outages.




Potential impacts from snow and ice accumulations

Expected Snowfall


36-hour Amounts From Tomorrow Morning Through Monday Afternoon

Key Messages

- Amounts are subject to change.
- Highest snowfall amounts north of I-64.
- Snow amounts will depend on how much sleet and freezing rain falls. Freezing rain will reduce snowfall amounts but increase ice potential.

Expected Ice Accumulation


Amounts From Sunday Morning until Late Sunday Night

Key Messages

- Amounts are subject to change.
- Ice amounts will be determined by the duration of time precipitation falls as freezing rain.
- Main time of concern is tomorrow afternoon into tomorrow night for north central Kentucky and southern Indiana.
- Southern Kentucky is expected to see a wintry mix tomorrow morning, with a change to rain for the afternoon and evening hours.

Very Cold After the Storm

Single Digit and Sub-Zero Temperatures Possible

Key Messages

- Temperatures will remain below freezing Monday night into next weekend.
- Some locations in north-central and northeast KY may drop slightly below zero Wednesday night, especially with snow on the ground.
- These very cold temperatures will have significant impact on any locations that are without power after the storm.
 Exposed water pipes may need protection.
