



Full List of CDBG-DR Infrastructure Projects Announced by Gov. Beshear 1/16/2025

Mayfield Electric and Water Systems Substation Upgrade - \$624,000

- Mayfield will construct and install a barrier around the new Mayfield Electric and Water Systems (MEWS) electrical substation. This electrical substation is the primary power source for the Pilgrims Pride hatchery, as well as a backup source for surrounding industrial users.

Jackson Quicksand Waterline Replacement - \$3,000,000

- Jackson will replace waterlines that were impacted by the floods. These waterlines are along Quicksand Road.

Jackson Stormwater Mitigation - \$4,881,000

- Conduct a study of the stormwater movement in the city, evaluate stormwater infrastructure, develop a stormwater management plan, and construct effective stormwater infrastructure as funding allows.

Letcher County Flood Repair and Mitigation - \$4,205,000

- Letcher County will use \$4.2 million to replace over 8,000 feet of waterlines and replace two pump stations, improving water pressure.

Leslie County Wilder Branch Pump Station - \$1,170,000

- The project consists of the replacement of the existing Wilder Branch pump station, the installation of a new pump station at Trace Fork and the replacement of water meters in the Wilder pump station service area.

Jenkins Wastewater Treatment Plant Improvements - \$1,474,063

- The city of Jenkins will use \$1.4 million to improve the city's wastewater treatment plant. The plant was damaged in the 2022 floods.

Jenkins Infrastructure and Stormwater Improvements - \$5,268,900

- The city of Jenkins will conduct a study of stormwater movement to determine the best mitigating measures to help prevent future flooding events.

City of Berry Lagoon Rehab and System Improvement - \$445,875

- The city of Berry will improve the existing wastewater treatment facility by replacing aging infrastructure and providing a more efficient and reliable wastewater treatment system.
