VETO MESSAGE FROM THE GOVERNOR OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY REGARDING HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 46 OF THE 2025 REGULAR SESSION

I, Andy Beshear, Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, pursuant to the authority granted under Section 88 of the Kentucky State Constitution, do hereby veto the following part:

Page 17, after "Franklin 90011 CS-1429 City of Frankfort Resurface Michael", delete "C".

I am vetoing this part because the correct name of the road for this County Priority Project is C. Michael Davenport Blvd. In addition, if the General Assembly has the power to appropriate through resolutions instead of bills, then the Governor has the power to line-item veto parts of such a resolution. See LRC v. Brown, 664 S.W. 2d 907 (Ky. 1984).

Page 7, after "Bracken 90016 CR-1214 Resurface Ford", delete "".

I am vetoing this part because the correct name of the road for this project is Fords Avenue. In addition, if the General Assembly has the power to appropriate through resolutions instead of bills, then the Governor has the power to line-item veto parts of such a resolution. See LRC v. Brown, 664 S.W.2d 907 (Ky. 1984).

Page 18, after "Gallatin 90014 CR-1208 Resurface Knox Lillard Road", delete "#2".

I am vetoing this part because the correct name of the road for this project is Knox Lillard Road. In addition, if the General Assembly has the power to appropriate through resolutions instead of bills, then the Governor has the power to line-item veto parts of such a resolution. See LRC v. Brown, 664 S.W.2d 907 (Ky. 1984).

Page 42, after "Powell 90063 CR-1306 Resurface Copper", delete "r", and after "as", delete "s".
