Dear Members of the General Assembly:

On behalf of the Kentucky Association of School Administrators' (KASA) Board of Directors, I am writing to express our support for the *Pre-K for All* initiative in Kentucky. As educators, we understand that early education can change a child's life, and we urge you to prioritize expanding voluntary preschool access during the 2026 Session of the Kentucky General Assembly.

The Advisory Committee's report provides compelling evidence that expanding access to high-quality preschool education will yield significant benefits for Kentucky's children, families, and economy. Currently, only 27 percent of Kentucky's four-year-olds are enrolled in public preschool programs, creating a gap that hinders their readiness for kindergarten and future academic success. By investing in *Pre-K for All*, we can ensure that every child starts their educational journey on the right foot, regardless of their family's income or background.

Supporting Children's Learning Journeys

Children who enter kindergarten unprepared face significant challenges as they progress through their educational journey, leading to delays in learning and barriers to academic success in subsequent grades. Research shows that children who attend high-quality preschool programs are better equipped for kindergarten, demonstrating stronger language, literacy, and social-emotional skills. These early advantages translate into improved performance in later grades, reducing the risk of falling behind and the need for remedial support. By ensuring that all Kentucky children have access to preschool, we can help bridge the readiness gap and set them up for lifelong success.

Supporting Workforce Development

A robust early childhood education system is vital for workforce development. Expanding access to preschool will enable working parents to pursue employment or further their education without the burden of excessive childcare costs. This initiative is not just educational; it is an economic imperative. When parents can work, they contribute to our economy, and children who attend preschool are more likely to succeed academically, leading to a well-prepared future workforce.

Empowering Families and Communities

Investing in *Pre-K for All* empowers families by providing affordable and accessible pre-K options, alleviating financial strain, and allowing families to thrive both economically and socially. The long-term benefits are evident: children who attend high-quality preschool programs are less likely to require special education services, more likely to graduate from high school, and more likely to pursue higher education, contributing positively to our communities.
